

Pests reported killed on our four trap lines by our team of six trappers:

March: 8 rats, 18 mice April: 11 rats, 18 mice

May: 5 rats, 10 mice, 2 weasels.

Our last weasel kill was in 2022 and the previous ones back in 2019. It is quite likely that these ones were lured to the Reserve by the persistently large number of mice around. Time will tell. We are prepared for them.

It is sobering for folk like us, who dedicate our time and effort over years to protect and enhance our country's unique biodiversity, to realise that there are others out there who seem to believe that the main value of our environment is what can be extracted from it.



A big thanks to Pic's Peanut Butter for supporting community conservation, helping to make New Zealand predator free.

Pic's supplies peanut butter as trapping bait - trappers report that predators rats and other predators find it irresistible!

Pic's Peanut Butter for traps \$15 per 5kg (incl. shipping)

Waste/end of run peanut butter is given to community groups for the cost of shipping and handling.

A small amount of blue powdered food dye has been added to the tub as an indicator this is not for human consumption. The 5kg bucket will bait over 1,000 traps. One bucket only per order: no shipping to the Chatham Islands.

MORE READING

This advice has appeared previously the Newsletter but is repeated here in case you missed it the first time!

After not having much success with Trapinators, I have made a few minor modifications and am now getting good hits: last month we got 4 possum, but since the modifications we have caught 18 possum.

- 1. As supplied, the bait clip is set right forward on the rod and secured with a spring (Photo One) In this position it is very difficult for the possum to reach the bait, so they put their claws into the trap. This sets off the trap, and they escape.
- 2. Modify by moving the bait clip (Photo Two) Having the bait clip above the entry makes it easier for possum to reach, and get caught (Photo Three)
- 3. Don't screw, or nail the trap to a tree. Instead, attach them to a bit of decking timber with short tech screws and then use an impact driver and 100mm tech screws to secure it to the tree. (Photo Four) This makes the traps easy to put up, and easy to move.

Placement of traps is important too. The secret is to find where possum track - it takes a bit of practice to see, but once you know what to look for, it's easy. The new blend of possum dough is very effective as a bait.




Photo 1: Trap as supplied from factory
